Tips for IEPT Meeting

(Individualized Educational Program Team)

Before The Meeting:

- Gather records you think may be helpful.
- Write down what you want to say
- Get advice. (Sometimes it helps to talk to people who are familiar with the process, such as another parent who has attended IEPT's for their own children.)
- Consider what your child's needs, abilities, and strengths are.
- Review the Parent Information Handbook and Procedural Safeguards for information on the IEP process.
- Invite someone for support.

During The Meeting:

- Share your ideas YOU KNOW YOUR CHILD BEST
- Ask questions
- Listen
- Keep discussions positive and focused on your child's educational needs.
- Be sure you are comfortable with it and understand all the points. Take it home to re-read, if necessary. Call your PAC representative if you have any questions.

After The Meeting:

- Put all copies of the forms given to you in a place you have access to (file folder, notebook, etc.)
- Contact your child's service provider(s) for updates, and/or progress reports periodically.
- Attend monthly PAC meetings.
